Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2021-2022 educational progress for the Sigma Academy for Leadership & Early Middle College (SALEMC). The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2019-20 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance, using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given. **SALEMC has not been given one of these labels by the Michigan Department of Education.**

The Academy embraces the continual improvement process and strives to enhance the curriculum for both college and career bound students and deliver instruction using research-based best practices. The Academy is focused on improving the educational program by utilizing evidence-based instructional methods and providing appropriate social-emotional support to address the needs of the whole child.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

- Process for assigning pupils to the school: At the beginning of the second semester, the Academy requires existing students to complete a reply card specifying if they are returning for the following school year. If the student replies that they are returning, they are given a slot in the next grade. The Academy posts an open-enrollment period beginning on the Second Count Day in February and concludes the last business day in March. Enrollment applications are available in the main office or they can be downloaded from the Academy's website. Applications are continually accepted throughout the summer and school year. If there are more applicants during the open enrollment period than there are available slots, a lottery is held.

- The status of the 3-5 year school improvement plan: The Academy's School improvement Plan is updated continuously. For the 2021 – 2022 school year, SALEMC submitted to the Michigan Department of Education in June 2021 its revised goals and progress. Parents can participate in the implementation and review of SALEMC's school improvement plan through the Parent School Improvement Team meetings. Meeting times for this Team are published in the yearly updated Welcome Packet and on the school website Calendar.
- A brief description of each specialized school: While the Academy does not operate any specialized schools, qualifying students can apply for Early Middle College Program.
- Identify how to access a copy of the core curriculum, a description of its implementation, and an explanation of the variances from the state's model: The Academy's core curriculum is aligned to both the Michigan State Standards and the Michigan Merit Curriculum (MMC) for the high school. High school students complete additional credits beyond the MMC, depending on the student's career pathway specialization. You may always contact your child's principal and ask to review the core curriculum for any grade and/or course.
- The aggregate student achievement results for any local competency tests or nationally normed achievement tests:
Aggregated student achievement results from the nationally recognized normed assessment, Northwest Evaluation Assessment (NWEA), can be reviewed within the AER link in the documents 20-21 NWEA Local Trend.
- Identify the number and percent of students represented by parents at parent-teacher conferences: 56% of the enrollment were represented in the Fall Conferences. Spring Conference SALEMC was 34%.
- SALEMC on post-secondary enrollment and number / percentage of students receiving a passing score leading to college credit can be reviewed in the 2021 – 2022 AER Documentation on the website. The Academy does not offer AP /IB courses.

SALEMC 's administrators and faculty congratulate the students for their perseverance in the time and rigors of the State's assessment process. The Academy's staff continuously reviews and analyzes all student achievement SALEMC to determine program and curricular adjustments to ensure all students are given the necessary instruction to succeed. As a parent, you are our partner in helping your child reach their fullest potential. Please join us at the Parent School Improvement Team meetings to participate in our planning and implementation of our School Improvement Plan.
